# The Alan Lindsey Interview

## With

## Peretz Katz

**Alan Lindsey:** Peretz, tell me about your early years.

**Peretz Katz:** I was born on 28 October 1970 in Johannesburg, South Africa. I went to primary and secondary public schools and then to University, all in Johannesburg, graduating with a law degree in 1993.

AL: How did your yiddishkeit develop?

PK: My family belonged to a Modern Orthodox shul, Waverley. Like most Jewish boys of that time, I attended shul on Shabbos for approximately one year before my Bar Mitzvah, and like most boys, my shul attendance petered out fairly soon after. At university I became involved with Ohr Somayach which led to my growth in Torah Judaism.



AL: And after university?

PK: In 1996, after completing my law degree I came to Israel to learn at Shappel's/Darche Noam. This was a pivotal year. It strengthened my Torah observance and inculcated a love for learning. Shappel's gave me the tools for learning which I have continued developing.

AL: What happened after your year in yeshiva?

PK: I emigrated to Australia with the rest of my family. Many South Africans were leaving South Africa at that time as a result of the political upheaval and Australia was a favoured destination. I continued to work as a lawyer (first in Melbourne and later in Perth). I studied for a Masters degree in tax and took up employment with Deloittes as a tax lawyer.

AL: How did you meet Shelley? Didn't she live in South Africa?

PK: During a visit to Johannesburg I was introduced to Shelley and we married in 1999 in Jerusalem. I should mention that punctuality is not one of my strong points - I was late for our first date and all subsequent dates so no-one should be surprised when I come late for *davening*! Despite never having been in Australia, Shelley agreed to live there.

AL: Tell me about those early years.

PK: We lived first in Melbourne (where I davened and learned part-time in the Lakewood Kollel) and then in Perth. During these six years we had two children, Gavi and Ashi who

were 4 and 2 respectively when we made Aliya in 2005.

AL: What made you make Aliya?

PK: Shelley and I weren't overly happy with the *Yiddishkeit* in Australia. Once we decided to move, Israel was the only real option. We wanted to maximise our growth and improve our children's *chinuch*.

AL: Tell me more about your children.

PK: Gavi our eldest, now 17, is learning at Ma'arava, a Yeshiva Tichuni where he dorms. Ashi is 15 and studying in Jerusalem at YTA. Akiva and Sarit were both born in Israel. Akiva is now 12 and goes to Magen Avot. Sarit, age 10, attends Bnot Malcha. We have taken the children to visit their extended family in South Africa, Australia and even England, and while they always have great fun, I am delighted that they are happiest here in Israel – B'H!

AL: So what happened to your employment with Deloittes when you made Aliya?

PK: To simplify our Aliya, I tried to transfer to the Tel Aviv office of Deloittes. But a bit of *hashgacho pratis* intervened. It led to my joining a property investment and asset management group based In Tel Aviv. My property career began here and it's what I have been doing for the last 13 years. We Invest in income producing commercial property located in Germany, mainly on behalf of South African institutions and family offices. Stability and growth is what attracts clients. Regular travel to Germany and to a lesser extent England and South Africa is now part of my lifestyle. I think the Duty Free Whiskey shop and the kiddush club benefit most from my trips!

AL: What has Aliya meant to you all?

PK: TG, Shelley and I are very happy in Israel. We love the people, the connection to our history, the rich Jewish lifestyle and most importantly the fact that we can live a Torah lifestyle like nowhere else. Israel's economic and social achievements are extraordinary and it's a real privilege to be living and contributing to the "Israel story" every day.

AL: Why did you choose RBS?

PK: In 2005, RBS was starting to take off and was developing as an ideal place for the young, Anglo, *frum* community. I knew several friends from school days and Shappel's already living here so it sounded like a soft landing. Seems we have been landing for 13 years and we're still here!

AL: How did you come to choose Ahavas Shalom?

PK: We first lived on Nachal Lachish, so Ahavas Shalom was the closest shul and its proximity a plus,

but the Rav was the main driver. I like to think I belong to the wider RBS community. So I also daven at other shuls including Beis Tefila, KSY, and Rabbi David's kehilla. But Ahavas Shalom has always been and remains my principal shul and place of learning.

AL: What do you like about Ahavas Shalom?

PK: Ahavas Shalom consists of diverse *mispallilim* - whether in age, *hashgafa*, *background* or culture. Yet somehow it works well. Everyone wants to grow in *ruchnias*, enthusiasm for learning, plus the vaad and the Rav who keeps it all together. The current vaad is doing great things - coming up with good ideas and executing them well.

AL: What you would like to see happening at Ahavas Shalom?

PK: Let's get an expanded shul - we need more space. Our success in keeping existing members and attracting new ones has led to over-crowding and some discomfort especially in the winter when there is only one minyan on *leil Shabbat*. We also need better accommodation for the women. Getting the Rav to spend more time here is certainly a goal. In this regard, the new Thursday night *mishmar* and Friday morning shiur has proved to be a massive success – a big *yasher koach* to Binyamin Rubenstein and the vaad on this initiative. We need to get women and children more involved thereby making Ahavas Shalom more of a family kehilla. Again I am confident the vaad will be able to initiate and execute the necessary developments.

AL: How has your learning developed since you made Aliya?

PK: In the night I am part of Rabbi Shmuel Katz's *Yoreh Deah* programme. It's fantastic and I enjoy it greatly. I greatly admire Rabbi Katz. In the mornings I am learning *messechet Succah* in R. Teichtel's Beis Tzvi kollel with a *chabura* of four and benefiting from Rabbi Ebu-Isaac's insights giving us a deeper understanding of the daf. Ahavas Shalom is providing a number of attractive learning options and is certainly competing successfully with the other learning programmes in RBS.

AL: Let's talk about Shelley.

PK: Shelley has created a beautiful home for me and the children and despite the difficulties is completely supportive of my life-style. She works as an occupational therapist and recently initiated the first ladies' *hatzala* group here in RBS. There are currently approximately sixty women undertaking a six month EMT course. Upon completion, the ladies will volunteer their time and expertise assisting in medical emergencies where women are involved.

AL: What are your and Shelley's dreams for the future?

PK: My dream is to daven in a larger, less cramped Ahavas Shalom with plenty of space for our children, and with the new room being used for *smochot*.

AL: Thank you for these insights and enjoy your special evening.

## RAV'S OPENING WORDS

We find ourselves after Ki Sisa which deals with the “sin of the golden calf”. We are about to recount the building of the Tabernacle in the wilderness. It is quite striking that the Parsha with this sin, was placed in the midst of the parshios of the building of the Tabernacle. Why is this so?

Aside from this, next week’s parsha starts off with the mitzvah of Shabbos which seems to be out of place. Yet the gemora tells us that the *melochos*, which are forbidden to be done on Shabbos are those exact *melochos* which were used to construct the Tabernacle. Obviously, Shabbos and the Tabernacle must have some kind of common ground.

I once heard from Rav Moshe Shapiro *zatzal* an explanation of this point. The world was created with the hope that Man would not sin, and the original Shabbos that was supposed to come would have been the ultimate fulfillment of creation. Unfortunately, Adam Harishon sinned, we spiraled downward until we were enslaved in Egypt, and with the Exodus we began the climb, with the climax of the receiving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. *Chazal* tell us that the state of *Klal Yisrael* at the receiving of the Torah was in fact comparable to that of Adam Harishon before he sinned. We gained a new lease on life, able again to reach the ultimate Shabbos. However, we again sinned by the golden calf and we received the second set of tablets, an alternative path to our ultimate purpose in this world. In this new world, the Tabernacle (or the Temple in Jerusalem) served as the place that was a “sanctuary”, so that we could come and serve Hashem in this place with no sin. In fact, *Chazal* tell us (*Tanchuma Pinchas* 12) that whoever lodged in Jerusalem after coming to the Holy Temple became a person with no sins on his account. Meaning, he lived on a plain of purity and repentance. This structure in the wilderness was designed by Betzalal, who knew how to draft the world from square one.

The Gemora tells us if a person’s *yetzer hara* is trying to get him to sin, one should reel the *yetzer* into the Beis Hamedrash. I would like to suggest that the idea which *Chazal* are projecting is that one who lives in the Beis Hamedrash is living in the sphere, unaffected by his *yetzer hara*. In fact, I heard my Rosh Yeshiva *shlita*,

explain the Chazal that says “after the destruction of the Temple, Hashem only has the 4 cubits of halacha” – the reason being that sin does not affect these holy places.

We are here tonight to strengthen our commitment to our “*mikdash me’at*” – our miniature Holy Temple. B”H in our holy place we have Torah, we have tefillah and it is a place where people are concerned for others. I think all those who are here tonight understand the importance of our holy institution and are proud to be infused with the spirituality that our shul brings. Tonight, as we try to expand and strengthen this holy place, we are looking to give ourselves a bigger and better place which will facilitate our growth as individuals.

My brocho to each and every one of us is that we use our *mikdash me’at* as much as we can , and surely, through this, we will become that much closer to the building of the ultimate Holy Temple in Jerusalem.

## דברי הרב

אנו עומדים אחרי פרשת כי-תsha אשר בה מזכיר עניין חטא העגל הזהב. בפרשיות הבאות התורה חוזרת ומספרת על בניית המשכן במדבר. זה מודיע לנו שהפרשה בה מזכיר חטא זה מכוקמת בין פרשיות של המשכן, וזה צריך הסבר. חוץ מזה, פרשת השבעה הבאה מתחילה עם המצווה של שבת, מה שנראה, לבארה, שלא במקומו. הגמרא מספרת לנו שהמלאות האסורות בשבת הן אלו שהיו נצרכות כדי לבנות את המשכן. ברור שחייב להיות איזשהו מכנה משותף בין שמירת שבת לבנית המשכן.

שמעתי פעם מפי הרב משה שפירא וצ"ל הסבר על נקודה זו. הוא ברא את העולם בתקופה שהאדם לא יחטא, והשבת הראשונה הייתה אמורה להיות השלמת הבריאה. אבל אדם הראשון חטא, ואנחנו הידרדרנו עד יציאת מצרים, ואחר מכן עליינו לשיא של קבלת התורה בהר סיני. חז"ל אומרם לנו כי מוצבו של כל ישראל בזמנו קבלת התורה היה, למעשה, זהה לזה של אדם הראשון לפני חטא. קיבלנו הוזמונות חדשות בחים, ושוב היינו יכולים להגיע לשבת האולטימטיבית.

אבל חטאנו בעגל הזהב, וקיבלונו את הלווחות השניות, אשר התו מסלול חילופי למורתנו האולטימטיבית בעולם הזה. בעולם חדש זה, המשכן (או בית המקדש בירושלים) שיכמש כ"מקלט", מקום שאינו נגוע בחטא, שבו אפשר לבוא ולעבוד את ה' במקומות נקי מחשש. למעשה, חז"ל אומרם לנו (מדרש תנחות פנחס י"ב) שמי שעלה בירושלים לאחר עלייתו לבית המקדש, הפך לאדם נקי מחשש, עם דף חדש. הוא חי ברכמה של עזה ותשובה. מבנה המשכן במדבר תוכנן על ידי בצלאל, שידע איך לציר את העולם מתחילה.

הגמרא מספרת לנו, "אם פגע בך מנוול זה (כלומר היצר הרע) משכחו בבית המקדש" (קידושין ל'ב). אני רוצה להציג שכונתם של חז"ל היא שאדם אשר שוכן בבית המקדש חי ב"מרחב מוגן", שאינו מושפע מן היצר הרע שלו. שמעתי הסבר מראש הישיבה שליליט"א לדבריו חז"ל: "ימים שהרב בית המקדש אין לו להקב"ה בעולם אלא ארבע אמות של הלכה בלבד" (ברכות ח:א) – מדוע? מכיוון שהחטא אינו מושפיע על המקומות הקדושים האלה.



אנחנו כאן הלילה כדי לחזק את הקשר שלנו למקדש מעט שלנו. ב"ה במקומות הקדוש שלנו יש לנו תורה, יש לנו תפילה, ויש מקום שבו לאנשים אפשר מנוחה תוך עזרה הדדית. אני חולש שכל הנוכחים כאן מבינים את חשיבותו של המכוסד הקדוש שלנו, וガイים להיותDDR זרים בדורותיהם שבאא מכיוון בית הכנסת. הערב, כשאנחנו מננים להרחה ולהזק את המקום הקדוש הזה, אנחנו פעילים ליצור לעצמנו מקום גדול וטוב יותר, אשר יעודד כל אחד ואחת מאייתנו בתהיליך הצמיחה האישית שלו.

ברכתך לכל אחד ואחת מאייתנו היא שנשתחם במקדש המעד שלנו ככל שנוכל. אני בטוח שבאמצעותנו, יהיה יותר קרובים לבניין בית המקדש החלשי בירושלים, במהרה בימינו – אכן.

## Kinyan Torah Acquiring Torah Knowledge

Bet Zvi is honored to have this year's guest of honor as one of its veteran and outstanding talmidim.

R' Peretz Katz has been part of Bet Zvi's morning program since its very inception. He was a central part of the Shabbos Iyun Chaburah, then led by the Rosh Kollel.

Currently, Peretz is an avid participant of one of our newest shiurim- The Kinyan Masechta Program. This program is led by Dayan Iair Ebu-Isaac.

In order to understand what's so special about Kinyan Masechta, we can read the following words, by Rav Ebu-Isaac himself.

Baruch Hashem I have the zechut of running the “Kinyan Masechta” program, Bet Zvi branch (this program has other branches in and outside Eretz Yisroel).

The program is known for its hatzlacha in helping people remember the limud, thus making a real “Kinyan” in the masechta (instead of just learning and then forgetting it ASAP... see Sanhedrin 99). This way, we are *mekayem* the mitzvah of *דיעת התורה* in שׁוּעַ הרב (see *והגית בו יומם וליל*) (see *היל' ת"ג*).

In our branch, the program is adapted to the great skills and aspirations of the *b'nay hachabura*. Our *talmidim* always aspire to understand everything in depth, and don't give up until every single *hava hamina* is explained. We check the *מפרשים* down to the last detail.

After the sugiyah is properly understood we move forward to the Halacha part, following each possi-



ble *mabalach*, until we come to our own conclusions.

Once in a while we do quick reviews, all the way from the beginning to where we hold now, backwards and forwards. Another very important feature in our *limud* is the time we dedicate for questions and brainstorming, so that each of us expresses himself in a dynamic way.

Sometimes our shiur splits into chavrutas, keeping the *limud* as fresh and exciting as possible. One of us shares a daily short summary (written by himself), and so we manage to remember the material while focusing on in-depth understanding, and keeping a nice pace at the same time.

The general atmosphere in the *Chaburah* is great, *Baruch Hashem*. It's friendly yet very serious.

Peretz is a very serious talmid, in more than one way. Even when he is away for business, he calls to listen in, and participate from afar by asking relevant questions.

I am so glad to be a shareholder!

וכפי שפירש הבית הלו' בפרשת ישלח על הפסוק "הצילני נא מיד אחיך עשו" זיל': דבהתחלת הгалות יהיה גוזר גזירות רעות בשמדות ויסורים וילחם בהם וירצח לאבדם, וה' ברוחמי לא יעוזם. ולבסוף, יאמר כי רוצה לישב בשלווה עם יעקב, וכוונתו דבזה ירחק את ישראל מעבודת ה' וידיהם מאכונתם... וזה הгалות השני שהייתה בסוף הגלויות הוא נקרא בפרק בפה רך. ומה הгалות נתירא יעקב אבינו יותר מיראתו מן הראשון, כיطبع האדם עלול להכשיל בו יותר מן הראשון, ועל כן הקדימו בתפלתו ואמר הצילני נא מיד אחיך ואח'ך אמר מיד עשו, יעו כי בראשון אין בו רק שייעבוד גופני והשני הוא שייעבוד בשניהם ברוחני וגם בגופני... וזה העניין יהיה נמשך עד ביתאת מושיח בב'א.

**על הפסוק הבא נתחכמה לו מפרש המדרש זהובא בילקווט שמעוני** שמות רמו קסג] בשעה שאמר הבה נתחכמה לו, קבע פרעה את כל ישראל, ואמר להם בבקשתו מכם עשו עמי היום בטובה, היינו דכתיב בפרק בפה רך, נטול של ומגיפה וכל מי שהיה רואה פרעה נטול של ומגיפה ועשה לבניהם, היה עוזה. מיד הלכו ישראל בזריזות ועשוו אומנות עמו כל היום לפי חנון לפי שעשו בעלי כח וגבורים, כיון שהחשייך העמיד עליהם נוגשים, ואמרו להם חשבו את הבניהם. מיד עמדו ומננו אותם, ואמר להם כזה אתם מעמידים לי בכל יום, מינה נוגשים של מצרים על שוטרים של ישראל.

הגמרה במסכת ברכות [סא]: מביאה את המעשה הידוע "תנו רבן פעם אחת גורה מלכות הרשעה שלא יעסקו ישראל בתורה, בא פפוש בן יהודה ומצאו לרבי עקיבא שהיה מקהיל קהילות ברבים ועובד בתורה. אמר ליה, עקיבא אי אתה מתירא מפני מלכות, אמר לו, אמשול לך משל, למה הדבר דומה – לשועל שהיה מהלך על גב הנهر, וראה דגים שהיו מותקצחים במקום למקומם, אמר להם מפני מה אתם בורדים, אמרו לו מפני רשות שחייבין עליינו בני אדם. אמר להם רצונכם שתעלו ליבשה, ונדרור אני ואתם בשם שדרו אבותי עם אבותיכם, אמרו לו, אתה הוא שאומרים עלייך פקה שבחיות, לא פקה אתה, אלא טפש אתה, ומה במקומות חיותנו אנו מותיראין, במקומות מיתתנו על אחת כנה וככה. אף אנחנו, עכשוינו שאנו יושבים ועובדים בתורה, שכתבו בה כי הוא חייך וארכך ימיך – כך, אם אנו הולכים ומובטלים ממנה – על אחת כמה וכמה.

**במבט ראשון** כמשמעותם את דברי השועל קשה שלא להבליע חיוך... וכי מי הוא זה שיתפתח לו ויסכים לעזוב את מקום חיתו בשבייל הבתוחות כאלו ואחרות.

אמנם כשתבונן בנמשל על טענת היצור הרע שמציע כל מיני הצעות לטובתיינו נראה שלא פעם הטענה נראהית די הגיוני, שהרי הגמורא במסכת שבת קה: מלמדת אותנו שכך אומנתו של יצור הרע, היום אומר לו עשה כך ולמחר אומר לו עשה כך. עד שאומר לו עובד עבודה זרה והולך ועובד.

וכך מספרת הגמורה במסכת מעילה יז. שפעם אחת גורה המלכות גורה שלא ישמרו את השבת, ושליא ימולו את בניהם, ושיבعلו את נדות. הלך רבי רואבן בן איסטרובלי והסתפר כדרכם הגויים, והלך וישב עליהם, אמר להם: מי שיש לו אויב יעני או יעריר, אמרו לו: יעני, אמר להם: אם כן, לא יעשו מלאכה בשבת – כדי שייענו, אמרו: טוב אמר, ליבטל, ובטלוה. חזור ואמר להם: מי שיש לו אויב יכחיש או יבריא, אמרו לו: יכחיש, אמר להם: אם כן, ימולו בניהם לשמונה ימים – וכייחשו, אמרו: טוב אמר, ובטלוה. חזור ואמר להם: מי שיש לו אויב הרבה או יתרם, אמרו לו: יתמעט, אם כן – לא יבעלו נדות, אמרו: טוב אמר, ובטלוה. הכלרו בו שהוא יהודי – החזירים.

וכשתבונן במעשה הזה, מודיע מלכתחילה הקשייבו לעצמו ומשנוכחו שהוא יהודי מייאנו בדבריו, והלא אם הדברים נכונים מהו אכפת להם מי אמרם, הרי לגופו של עניין הטענה צודקת. אלא דבר אחד הבינו הרומיאים היטב: "עצות טובות כלל שתהיינה, אם הם באות מהאויב לא יתכן שהם לעובתינו".


This year was no different. Many of us gathered in the Beis Medrash, learned *meseches Makos*, and celebrated the learning of more torah.







## THE AHAVAS SHALOM LOAN GEMACH

Loans are given for a maximum of six months, and require a guarantor. No questions are asked as to the purpose of the loan, but we can imagine that they are for various emergency needs, bridging a difficult—sometimes frightening—time between when a payment is due and when expected funds are supposed to arrive.
