### Learning From Others

Some people are truly exceptional. So exceptional that they may indeed be the best in their particular field, be that Torah, medicine, or household management. However, the Chofetz Chaim tells us that no one can "have it all". We need to rely on others to achieve true perfection. Chazal tell us that we can see this fact when the Torah tells us that Moshe and Aharon were "equal". Where they truly equal? No. But in the way that Moshe excelled in *din*, Aharon excelled equally in *Shalom* – though at the same time, each of them paled compared to the others particular aspect of greatness.



The story is told of Reb Meir from Premishlan, a great Hassidic Rebbe who happened to once be in the same town as Reb Shloime Eiger, a strong *misnagid* to *chasidus*. The two tzaddikim met and were in private discussion for quite some time. Afterwards, Reb Meir saw that his Hassidim were curious as to the nature of the conversation. To answer them, he quoted the pasuk from this week's parsha:

"But Malchizedek, king of Salem, brought forth bread and wine; and he was priest of G-d the Most High." (Bereishis 14:18)

It seems that the Torah should have written the fact that he "brought forth bread and wine" at the very end of the sentence after introducing who Melchizedek was. Reb Meir explains that Avraham Avinu was the pillar of *Chesed*. Chazal tell us that Melchizedek was Shem, the son of Noah, who ran a Yeshiva which was the premier place of learning for many generations. Both Yitzchak and Yaakov learned there. When Melchizedek and Avraham met, they each tried to learn from their peer's point of excellence. Therefore, Melchizedek brought forth bread and wine to do *chesed* as Avraham would do; the phrase at the end therefore does not refer back to Melchizedek, but instead the Hebrew word "*hoo*" refers to Avraham, who learned from Melchizedek to be a priest to G-d.

We must take to heart that as good as we are, there are areas in which others can teach us a thing or two. Let us follow the example of our Forefather Avraham, for as great as he was, understood the importance of learning from others. "Who is a Chacham? He who learns from all men." (Avos 4:1)

## Mishneh Berurah Q&A

Questions and answers culled from the Keter Hatorah Semicha Program in Shulchan Aruch Orach Chaim with the Mishneh Berurah. For details on this program see [www.keterhatorah.com](http://www.keterhatorah.com)

**Q** On the last day of Pesach, Mr. Kagan suggested that all Kohanim sing a particular tune for *Birkas Kohanim*, while Rabbi Cohen suggested a *different* tune, and Mr. Kahn suggested that they compromise and sing Mr. Kagan's tune after the first verse and with the Rabbi's tune after the next two verses. May all the Kohanim agree to Mr. Kahn's compromise suggestion?

**A** No. The Kohanim are only permitted to sing one tune from the beginning until the end, and all the Kohanim must sing the same tune together from the beginning until the end.

**Q** Reuven's son Hudi peeked out from under his father's tallis to see the Kohanim. Was this permissible?

**A** "Peeking" is permissible, but staring is not permissible. However, the *minhag* is to not even "peek" at the Kohanim, as during the time of the Beis Hamikdash, it was **forbidden** to even peek at the Kohanim, since they were using the "*sheim meforash*" — Hashem's real name. **Q** Reuven was at his place at the Eastern wall on Yom Tov and, when it was time for *duchening*. However, Moe Shapiro was behind him, still in the midst of his personal *shemoneh esrei!* May Reuven take his 3 steps backward (into Moe's *daled amos*) so that he could be in front of the Kohanim for the *brocho* of *Birkas Kohanim*, since those that are behind the Kohanim do not receive a *brocho*?

1. Yes. Reuven may step back into Moe's space so that he can receive the *brocho*.
2. No. Reuven may not step back into Moe's space, and he unfortunately loses the *brocho*.
3. No. Reuven may not step back into Moe's space, but he will still get the *brocho*.

**A** 3. Reuven should stand in his place, as he is not permitted to move backward into Moe Shapiro's *daled amos*. However, Reuven is considered *ahnus* and since it is not his fault for not being in front of the Kohanim, he will still receive the *brocho*.

## משולחנו של הרב אברהם ברוך זכריש

## ללמוד מכל אדם

ש אנשים שהם באמת יוצאים מן הכלל. עד כדי שהם אפילו עשויים להיות הכי טובים בתחום מסוים שלהם, בין אם זה בתורה, רפואה, או ניהול משק הבית. עם זאת, החפץ חיים מזהיר אותנו שאף אחד לא יכול להיות ה"כל בו". כל אחד צריך להסתמך על אחרים כדי להגיע לשלמות אמיתית. חז"ל אומרים לנו שאנחנו יכולים לראות דוגמא לעובדה הזאת כשהתורה מספרת לנו על משה ואהרון שהיו "שווים". האם הם באמת היו שווים? לא, אלא שבדרך שבה הצטיין משה במשפט, הצטיין אהרון בשלום, אם כי בכל זאת, כל אחד מהם היה פחות מוכשר בהשוואה לגודלו של השני.

מספרים סיפור על רבי מאיר מפרימישלו, אדמו"ר חסידי גדול, שפעם התארח בעיר באותו זמן שר' שלמה איגור, מתנגד ידוע, גם ביקר שם. שני הצדיקים נפגשו והיו בשיח פרטי למשך זמן רב. לאחר מכן, ר' מאיר ראה כי חסידים שלו היו סקרנים על מה היתה השיחה. כדי לענות להם, הוא ציטט את הפסוק מפרשת השבוע: "וּמִלְכֵי-צֶדֶק מְלֻדְּ שָׁלֵם, הוֹצִיא לֶחֶם וַיִּוֶן; וְהוּא כֹהֵן, לְקַל עֲלִיוֹן" (בראשית יד:יח)

כנראה שהתורה היתה צריכה למעשה לכתוב שהוא "הביא לחם ויין" בסוף הפסוק מיד לאחר שהציג את מלכי-צדק כ"כהן לקל עליון". רבי מאיר מסביר שאברהם אבינו היה עמוד החסד. וחז"ל מספרים לנו שמלכי-צדק היה שם, בנו של נח, אשר ניהל ישיבה, המקום המוביל של לימוד התורה במשך דורות רבים. שם למדו גם יצחק וגם יעקב. כאשר נפגשו מלכי-צדק ואברהם, כל אחד מהם ניסה ללמוד מנקודת המצוינות של השני. לכן, מלכי-צדק "הוציא לחם ויין" כדי ללמוד איך לעשות חסד כמו שאברהם היה עושה, אבל המילים "והוא כהן, לקל עליון" אינם מתייחסים למלכי-צדק, אלא המילה "הוא" מתייחסת לאברהם, שלמד ממלכי-צדק להיות כהן לקל עליון.

לכן אנחנו חייבים להפנים שככל שאנחנו טובים, יש תחומים שבהם אחרים יכולים ללמוד אותנו דבר או שניים. בואו נלך בדוגמה של אברהם אבינו, כי גדול ככל שהיה, הבין את חשיבות הלמידה מאחרים. "איזהו חכם? הלומד מכל אדם." (אבות ד:א)
