
Bottoms Up

This month shall mark for you the beginning of the months; it shall be the first of the months of the year for you. (Shemos 12:2)

There is a famous story told about a *Chassidishe* Jew who was extremely poor. Everything that he tried to do turned sour. He came to a point of despair, sat down and thought



about his lowly position. But then he suddenly jumped up and began dancing! "Reb Yid must have cracked!" said the people around him, shaking their heads sadly. "Nothing could be farther from the truth!" he explained. "I was in the worst possible



situation and I saw no way out. The wheels of fortune spun me to the very bottom. But then I **turning** realized that every wheel has a part which is on the bottom, and if the wheel is still turning then that lowest point must soon rise to become highest point. Therefore, it is clear to

me that my fortune will change, and I will rise to a status of being financially solvent." In fact, that is actually what happened to this man.

We know the Jews in Egypt were at the 49th level of impurity and if they would have remained in Egypt even a moment longer there would have been no way to extricate them from their lowly impure state. We assume that this forced redemption happened because Hashem had, so to speak, no choice. However, I believe that there must be a deeper meaning as to why we were redeemed, specifically when we were at rock bottom.

The Jews are compared to the moon, and the first commandment that the Jewish nation was given was to sanctify the lunar month. There is a story told in the


Masks

Gemora in Chulin (60b) explaining why the moon waxes and wanes. At the time of Creation, the moon complained to Hashem that two kings can't wear one crown, and as there is no difference between him and the sun, one of the two had to be made smaller than the other. Hashem therefore told the moon to make himself smaller. When one looks at the Gemora it seems that the moon's original statement was considered a sin. Therefore, the significance of a new moon reappearing every month may be to remind us that there are opportunities to start a new phase; a new page; a new beginning. We may have sinned in the past, but we can start fresh again.

Klal Yisrael was redeemed from Egypt not only from their physical bondage but from their attachment to the world of idol worship. As the angels asked, "What is the difference between the Jews and the Egyptians, as both serve idols!?" The answer is that we have the ability to change. We can leave the most negative environment and grow to become a strong and vibrant Torah-observing nation. This capacity is not really found in other nations. Other nations may come and go. Sometimes they may seem to reappear years later, but they are actually totally new entities (e.g. the modern day Greeks and Egyptians have no connection to the Ancient Greeks or Egyptians).

The Jewish nation sometimes might be at the top and sometimes might be at the bottom, but we are here forever and thriving.

The first commandment given to the Jewish Nation is to sanctify the month of Nisan. Rebirth from the point in which the moon was totally obscured, but with the potential to become vibrant and full on the fifteenth of the month – exactly the day that we left Egypt.


It is essential that we all believe in this concept of cycles in life: no matter how far away we have ventured, we can always repent and return and be liberated from our circumstances; *Uva letzion go'al* – we should merit the ultimate redemption speedily.

Shul's Sheimos Bin

The shul's bin for *Sheimos/Geniza*, is *NOT for private use*. That means that you cannot bring your books and papers from home, and put them in there. The shul pays money to maintain the *Sheimos* bin, and there is a lot of *tircha* involved in it. If you have something that you are using at shul, and it needs to go into the *Sheimos* bin, that's fine.

Your home *Sheimos* should be taken to the public גניזה bins. The nearest one is located on Nachal Gilo, next to the *Makolet*.

משולחנו של הרב אברהם ברוד זכריש

מטה-מעלה

הַחְדֶשׁ הַזּה לָכֶם רַאשׁ חָדָשִׁיִם רִאשׁוֹן הוּאֹ לָכֶּם לְחַרְשִׁי הַשְּׁנָה: (שמות יב:ב)

יש סיפור מפורסם על חסיד שהיה עני מאוד. כל מה שהוא ניסה לעשות לא הצליח. הוא הגיע למצב של ייאוש, התיישב וחשב על מעמדו הנמוך. אבל פתאום הוא קפץ והתחיל לרקוד! "רב ייד בטח השתגעת!" אמרו האנשים סביבו, ונענעו בראשם בעצב. "שום דבר לא יכול להיות רחוק יותר מהאמת!" הוא הסביר. "הייתי במצב הגרוע ביותר האפשרי ונראה היה שאין דרך לצאת מזה. גלגלי המזל סובבו אותי ממש לתחתית. אבל אז הבנתי שלכל גלגל יש חלק שנמצא בתחתית, וכל עוד הגלגל עדיין מסתובב אז הנקודה הנמוכה ביותר צריכה לעלות בקרוב כדי להפוך לנקודה הגבוהה ביותר. לכן ברור לי שהמזל למעשה, זה בעצם מה שקרה לאיש הזה.

אנו יודעים שהיהודים במצרים הגיעו לשער המ"ט בטומאה, ואם הם היו נשארים במצרים אפילו עוד רגע היו יורדים לשער החמישים, היו נטמעים שם ואי אפשר היה להוציא אותם. אנו מניחים שהגאולה הייתה צריכה להתרחש אז כי לה', כביכול, לא הייתה ברירה. עם זאת, אני מאמין שצריכה להיות משמעות עמוקה יותר למה נגאלנו דווקא כשהיינו בנקודה הנמוכה ביותר שלנו.

היהודים משולים לירח. בנוסף, המצווה הראשונה שניתנה לעם ישראל הייתה קידוש החודש. יש סיפור בגמרא (חולין ס:ב) המסביר מדוע הירח דועך והולך. בזמן בריאת העולם, "אמרה ירח לפני הקב"ה רבש"ע אפשר לשני מלכים שישתמשו בכתר אחד! אמר לה, לכי ומעטי את עצמך". כשמסתכלים על הגמרא נראה שהאמירה המקורית של הירח נחשבה לחטא. לכן, המשמעות של ירח מחודש שמופיע בכל חודש עשויה להזכיר לנו שיש הזדמנויות להתחיל שלב חדש; דף חדש; התחלה חדשה. אולי חטאנו בעבר, אבל אנחנו יכולים להתחיל מחדש עכשיו.

בני ישראל נגאלו ממצרים לא רק משעבודם הפיזי אלא מדבקותם בעבודה זרה. כפי ששאלו המלאכים, "מה ההבדל בין היהודים להמצרים, הלא שניהם עובדי עבודה זרה!!" התשובה היא שיש לנו את היכולת לשנות. אנחנו יכולים לצאת מהסביבה השלילית ביותר ולצמוח להיות אומה חזקה ששומרת תורה בהתלהבות. יכולת זו לא ממש נמצאת באומות
