Living It

Go and cry in the ears of Yerushalayim, saying, Hashem said; I remember in your favour, the devotion of your youth, your love as a bride, when you went after me in the wilderness, in a land that was not sown. (Yirmiyahu 2:2)

Hashem praises *Klal Yisrael* for their willingness to leave Egypt without any provisions. Rav Sholom Schwadron points out that if just out



of the blue someone was asked by G-d to leave a safe and secure environment and follow blindly in the desert, that would demonstrate love and devotion to Hashem. However, the Jews just had a year-long experience of miracle after miracle, from *dam* (blood) to the plague of the first born. They saw that Hashem was capable of everything. What kind of a test is it for them to follow an all-powerful G-d into the desert? If He can encapsulate fire in hail, He can definitely have food packages rain down from Heaven!

I would like to add another thought about the Seder night. There are customs that we do at the seder that are there to mimic actually leaving Egypt. There are those who put the matzah on their shoulder and walk around the table just as the Jews did with their provisions when they left Egypt. What is the point of this pantomime?

Rabbi Yisroel Salanter tells us that what a person knows in his brain and what he feels in his heart are not necessarily connected. I will just use the example of standing at the edge of a pool, watching all your friends frolic inside, saying, "come on in – the water's great!" You stick your big toe in the water and you think that it is a bit too cold. Everyone screams at you, "that is only at the beginning. Once you jump in it will be great!" and you know that they are right. But it can still take some courage to jump into the water.

Rav Sholom Schwadron says that it is one thing called "knowing" Emunah, which comes from seeing miracles for a year. There is another thing called "living" Emunah. Even though you have seen others live with Emunah, to actually have the courage to act on it yourself is a step that shows much deeper love and conviction and is not an automatic result of your knowing what is right. I once heard an allegory: A man



fell off a cliff, but managed to grasp a large branch on his way down. While dangling hundreds of feet above the valley floor, he cried out to G-d for rescue. A Heavenly voice thundered out, "Let go and I will catch you!" but the person questioned, "How do I know that you are G-d?" The voice then responds, "What kind of a sign would you like? Name it and I will prove that I am the Creator!" The man makes a request, and G-d shows that He is omnipotent. Yet, it would still take courage for the man to let go and rely entirely on Hashem. This is courage that is borne out of love for Hashem.

Tonight, on the night of the Seder, it is not enough to just academically learn the facts of Emunah. The Rambam says that a person must envision himself as if he himself is leaving Egypt and grow in his love of Hashem. Let us take a deep breath, give ourselves over to Hashem, and enjoy our salvation. Good Yom Toy!

Mishneh Berurah Q&A

Questions and answers culled from the Keter Hatorah Semicha Program in Shulchan Aruch Orach Chaim with the Mishneh Berurah. For details on this program see www.keterhatorah.com. Questions written by Lev Seltzer and used with permission.

Shmuel, pointing to the Romaine lettuce that the during Pesach. waiter put on his seder table. "When I went to Pesach Seder at my grandparents in The Bronx, we always had horseradish for maror!" Why did the previous generations of Jews, such as those at the time of the M.B. and A.H., use horseradish rather than romaine lettuce for maror?

M.B.: Romaine lettuce usually had small bugs and worms in it and, if the lettuce was not checked properly, the members of the family would end up violating a Biblical prohibition of eating bugs in order to fulfil a Rabbinical commandment of eating maror.

A.H.: Romaine lettuce was very expensive compared to the price of horseradish, and only the rich people could afford leaning. it. The custom, therefore, developed to use only the lessexpensive horseradish.

However, both agree that if bug-free romaine lettuce can be obtained, it is preferable to use that rather than horseradish. Source: Siman 473 M.B. 42; A.H. 13

When Grandpa Shmuel said "hamotzi" on Shabbos and Yom Tov, he always dipped his bread in salt before eating it. Should he do the same with his matzah at either of these meals?

- The Pesach Seder. 1.
- 2. The Shabbos Chol Hamoed Pesach meals.

1. No. At the Pesach seder we eat "lechem oni" poor man's bread — and we should eat it as if we are so poor we cannot even afford salt.

2. Yes. Just as we dip the bread in salt at a regular Shabbos

"Avrumy, you're not supposed to lean while eating maror" said Goldy, his sister, as she nudged him at the Kagan family Seder table. "Too late!" he said. "I already ate it all!" What does Avrumy need to do now?

- 1. He must eat another *kezayis* of maror without leaning.
- 2. He does not need to do anything, as he has fulfilled his obligation to eat maror.

2. While one is not required to eat the maror while leaning, leaning does not disqualify the mitzvah and Avrumy does not need to eat again without

Mrs. Brochstein bought a beautiful piece of beef for her Pesach Seder. According to the M.B., may she prepare it by placing it into a covered pot with spices, put it into the oven, and let it roast in its own juices (otherwise known as making a "pot roast")?

No. Ashkenazim do not have roasted meat on the first night of Pesach. While pot roast is not exactly the same as roasted meat, it is close enough that it is forbidden. However, if Mrs. Brochstein were to add some wine, water or sauce to the roast before cooking, then it would be permitted.

רבי ישראל סלנטר אומר לנו שמה שאדם יודע במוחו ומה שהוא מרגיש בליבו אינם קשורים בהכרח. אני אתן דוגמה של אחד שעומד על שפת הבריכה, צופה בכל חבריו משתובבים בפנים, ואומרים, "תכנס - המים נהדרים!" אתה מכניס את הבוהן הגדולה שלך למים ואתה חושב שזה מרגיש קצת קר מדי. כולם צועקים עליד, "הקור רק לשניה. ברגע שתקפוץ למים זה יהיה נהדר!" ואתה יודע שהם צודקים. אבל עדיין צריך קצת אומץ לקפוץ למים.

הרב שלום שוודרון אומר שזה דבר אחד "לדעת" אמונה, שנובעת מכך שראינו ניסים במשך שנה. אבל יש עוד דבר שנקרא "לחיות" אמונה. גם אחרי שראית אחרים חיים עם אמונה, בעצם האומץ לפעול לפי זה בעצמך, זה צעד שמראה אהבה ושכנוע הרבה יותר עמוקים ואינו מובן מאליו אפילו אם אתה יודע מה נכון. שמעתי פעם משל: אדם נפל מצוק, אבל הצליח לאחוז בענף גדול בדרכו למטה. בעודו משתלשל מאות מטרים מעל קרקעית העמק, זעק לה' להצלה. קול שמימי רעם, "עזוב, אני אתפוס אותך!" אבל האדם שאל: "איך אני יודע שאתה אלוקים!" לאחר מכן הקול עונה, "איזה סוג של סימן תרצה? ציין זאת ואני אוכיח שאני הבורא!" האיש מבקש, וה' מראה שהוא כל יכול. עם זאת, עדיין נדרש ממנו אומץ להרפות ולהסתמך לחלוטין על ה'. זהו אומץ שנובע מאהבת ה'.
