Take a Good Look

"View, from Your sacred residence..." (Devarim 26:15)


Chazal tell us (Medrash Tanchuma that word Sisa) the "Hashkifa" (which means "to gaze with intent"), usually has bad connotations. However, our parsha is the exception. Here, through the mitzvah of tzedakah,



Hashem moves off the seat of judgement to that of mercy. The question is, "How does this work? Also, why is it, so to speak, that when Hashem gazes normally, He is looking at things strictly?"

We are aware that many times when people sin, even though they - G-d forbid - do it with intent, they have a gnawing feeling in their stomach, for they know and understand that it is wrong and they truly feel guilty about doing it. They just could not overcome their temptation. Even when people do mitzvos, often there may be some personal gain involved. Therefore, when Hashem examines our actions and He sees different motivations even in our good actions, some wonderous and some less desirable, what type of opinion of us does Hashem reach?

My father once compared this to golf: Each hole in golf has a certain par, which is the expected number of strokes needed to get the ball into the hole. No one is expected to hit a hole in one, but that is certainly

Some questions for Rosh Hashanah! From RBSsemicha.com

Q&A: Shofar Shtik

On the first day of Rosh Hashanah, which fell out on a Shabbos, Rabbi Cohen hosted Reuven and his family. "I miss the fact that we may not blow the shofar on Shabbos," the Rabbi lamented to his guests, "but that doesn't mean we can't find some connection to the shofar today." He then turned around and to the shock of all the guests took a shofar out of his display cabinet, put his hand on the small opening, filled it with seltzer water, and drank. "I thought a shofar was mukzeh?!" asked Hudy. "We can't blow it on Shabbos, but we are permitted to use it in this manner," answered the Rabbi. The next day of Rosh Hashanah, Sunday, as Hudy was eating lunch with his family, he decided to do the same trick. He took his father's shofar off the shelf and went to fill it with water. Is he permitted to do this same "trick" on the second day of Rosh Hashanah that Rabbi Cohen did on the first day of Rosh Hashanah?

No. When Rosh Hashanah is not on Shabbos, though the shofar is not *mukzeh*, it is designated **_** for the mitzvah of blowing shofar to the exclusion of other mundane actions. On Shabbos, while it is still mukzeh and forbidden to blow, one may use it for itself -l'gufo — such as for a cup.

Q&A: I'm Gonna Wash That Phlegm Right out of my Shofar

Aharon Deer took the shofar that had previously belonged to Murray Epstein's great-grandfather and tried to blow it for him in the Yorkville Home for the Aged, but no sound came out. "Oy!" coughed Murray. "I had tried to blow it earlier in the day, but it must be filled with phlegm — my throat is clear now and the phlegm's gotta be somewhere!" he chortled. "Come. Let me wash it out in the sink here in my room." Is it permissible for Murray to wash out the shofar on Rosh Hashanah day?

Yes. This is no different than washing dishes, which is permitted on Shabbos and Yom Tov. However, this is probably not a good idea, as the water can affect the sound of the shofar. It might be better to try to blow out the phlegm, bang it out, or use a tissue to wipe it out. OC 586 M.B. 89

mitzvos, though it is unrealistic to expect him to execute his obligation properly. Therefore, Hashem will judge him according to his ability.

There are certain mitzvos, however, that their challenge is great enough that it almost is as if we don't expect one to succeed at it at all. Whatever one does accomplish regarding these mitzvos demonstrates his desire to serve Hashem. This applies to the mitzvah of *tzedakah*. A person takes his hard-earned money and gives it away gladly. He does this with the understanding that Hashem made him the custodian of these funds, so that he can have the privilege of allocating the funds needed by other human beings. Since this person left his "comfort zone" and did the opposite of what good sense would say, Hashem reciprocates and even if this mitzvah was done without the proper intent (*shelo lishma*), or was otherwise faulty, Hashem will only see the good in this person's act.

With this idea we can understand why at this time of year there is a special emphasis on giving *tzedakah*. Our selflessness and reaching out to help others will bring about *mida kneged mida* on the way Hashem looks at us during the days of judgement. He will see that we acted out of the box, and hopefully He will act similarly with

I would like to expand on this thought with a quote from HaRav Aharon Leib Shteinman Z"L. We say at the end of bentching, וְלֹא רָאִיתִי צַּוִּיק נֶעֵיוֹב (I have not seen a righteous man abandoned). Reb Aharon Leib added: I have not seen a *mevater* (one who gives deference to another) lose out.

At this time of year, aside from giving *tzedakah*, we should find other ways to leave our comfort zone for the benefit of others. We also should try to take advantage of the opportunities to (for example) give away our place in line, our *chavrusa*, or a parking spot, to someone who is in need. By doing this, Hashem's gaze on us, on the *yom hadin*, should be a positive one, and one that will bring us *brocho* in the year to come.

משולחנו של הרב אברהם ברוך זכריש

תסתכל טוב

"הַשִּׁקִיפָּה מִמְעוֹן קָדִשִּׁךְ..." (דברים כו:טו)

חז"ל אומרים על המילה 'השקיפה',שפירושה 'להביט בכוונה', "אמר רבי אלכסנדרי, גדול כחן של בעלי מעשרות, שהופכין את הקללה לברכה. שבכל מקום שנאמר בו השקפה, לשון צער הוא... חוץ מזו, השקיפה ממעון קדשך וברך..." (מדרש תנחומא כי תשא:יד), שבאמצעות מצוות צדקה, ה' עובר ממידת הדין למידת הרחמים. השאלה היא "איך זה עובד?" וכמו כן, "מדוע, כביכול, בדרך כלל ה' מסתכל עלינו בקפדנות?"

אנו מודעים לכך שהרבה פעמים כאשר אנשים חוטאים, למרות שהם – חלילה – עושים זאת בכוונה, יש להם תחושה לא נוחה בבטן, כי הם יודעים ומבינים שזה לא בסדר והם באמת מרגישים אשמה על חטאם. הם פשוט לא הצליחו להתגבר על הפיתוי. אפילו כשאנשים עושים מצוות, בדרך כלל יש בכך תועלת אישית כלשהי. לכן, כאשר ה' בוחן את מעשינו והוא רואה מניעים שונים אפילו במעשינו הטובים, חלקם מופלאים וחלקם פחות רצויים, לאיזה סוג של מסקנה מגיע ה' לגבינו?

אבא שלי השווה את זה פעם למשחק הגולף: לכל חור בגולף יש שווי מסוים, שהוא המספר המוערך של חבטות הדרושות כדי להכניס את הכדור לחור. אף אחד לא חושב להכות לחור בחבטה אחת, אבל זה בהחלט הכי טוב. לפי רמת הכישורים של השחקן, כך נצפה ממנו לביצועים טובים יותר. כך גם בעבודת ה', ה' מעריך את מצבו של כל אדם ומספק את המקדם הנצרך כדי שיוכל להגיע לרמה הדרושה.

הרב שלמה זלמן אוירבך דן ברעיון זה בשו"ת בנושא ילדים לקויי נפש. לדבריו, ייתכנו מצבים שבהם אכן חלה על הילד חובה מלאה לקיים מצוות, אם כי לא ריאלי לצפות ממנו לקיים את חובתו כראוי. לכן ה' ישפוט אותו לפי יכולתו.

עם זאת, יש מצוות מסוימות שהקושי שלהן גדול מספיק כדי שזה כמעט כאילו אנחנו לא מצפים שאף אחד יצליח בזה בכלל. לגבי מצוות אלו, כל מה שאדם עושה מוכיח את רצונו לעבוד את ה'. זה מתייחס דווקא למצוות צדקה. אדם לוקח את כספו שהרוויח בעמל רב, ותורם אותו בשמחה, מתוך הבנה שה' מינה אותו לאפוטרופוס של הכספים הללו, כדי שיזכה להקצות את הכספים הדרושים לבני אדם אחרים. מכיוון שאדם זה עזב את "אזור הנוחות" שלו ועשה את ההיפך מהרגיל, ה' מגיב באותה מידה, וגם אם מצווה זו נעשתה שלו לשמה, או הייתה פגומה איכשהו, ה' יראה רק את הטוב שבמעשה הצדקה ושלו

עם הרעיון הזה נוכל להבין מדוע בתקופה זו של השנה יש דגש מיוחד לתת צדקה. חוסר האנוכיות והנדיבות שלנו בעזרה לזולת יביאו לידי מידה כנגד מידה בדרך שבה ה'
