Holy Service With a Smile

"Speak to all the congregation of the children of Yisrael, and say to them, You shall be holy: for I am holy." (Vayikra 19:2)

The generally accepted meaning of being "holy" is to separate oneself, as it seems from the Ramban at first glance. The following question is asked, "If holiness means separate to



oneself, what is the meaning of the rest of the verse '...For I am holy'? Does Hashem have an issue and struggle that He needs to separate from other things?" I think it is obvious that unlike people, Hashem is naturally *Kadosh* and separated. So what is the meaning of Hashem's demand that we separate ourselves like He is separated?

I would like to explain it based on something I saw from Rav Baruch Mordechai Ezrachi (1929-2023). There is an expression in English "Once an alcoholic, always an alcoholic." This means that even if a person goes through a 12-step program to cure his alcoholism, his natural tendency to seek alcohol will always be there. The only difference is that he will be able to control himself around alcohol. The 12-step program did not actually "cure" his disease of alcoholism, but rather it gave him tools so that he can live with it and overcome the drive, which relieves the pressure on him.

Rav Yisroel Salanter is quoted as saying that it is easier to learn all of Shas than to change one middah (personality trait). I believe that he is telling us that in the world of Torah, success is not keeping the beast at bay, but rather success is eradicating the beast, creating a reality where we have no desire for that illicit feeling or conduct. This is accomplished through learning mussar, gaining an appreciation of what is good, until we naturally understand and are repulsed by that which is not good. By working on our middos, we can create a different appreciation of the world.

There is another way to accomplish this. This is by

actually abstaining from certain things. Rav Ezrachi explains that the idea that the Ramban teaches us, separating ourselves from certain physical activities, is not referring only to the physical separation, but rather it is a step in separating ourselves from the desire itself.

I would like to share with you an experience that I once had, which

illustrates this idea. I was watching a child eat an ice cream cone and I was mesmerized by his elation as he was totally absorbed in this pleasure. My initial reaction was, "Boy, I wish I could enjoy an ice cream like him!" But after having that thought, I had a feeling of revulsion, and I said to myself, "I hope I NEVER enjoy an ice cream like that!" While it may be perfectly fine for a five-year-old child to be totally consumed with a particular pleasure, this type of behavior is inappropriate for an adult.

I recall that after that incident, eating ice cream just wasn't the same as before. I am not saying that it is not tasty or that I don't enjoy it, but I actually removed myself, to a degree, from that pleasure.

A successful "kadosh" would not feel deprived. Instead he would feel elated, but not just because he overcame (though that is not a bad reason to be elated, in its own right), but rather because he understands that he is "better than that."

Similarly, we might see children in an intense fight over something they both desire, yet when we discover the object of the fight we might respond, "That is so petty! Aren't you embarrassed to be fighting over that!?" That viewpoint comes from being removed from that desire.

In short, to be holy does not mean having to fight the battle, rather it means to achieve a level where there isn't even a battle.

That is truly G-dly and it starts with our accepting those abstentions with a smile on our face.

Q&A:What Day Is It?

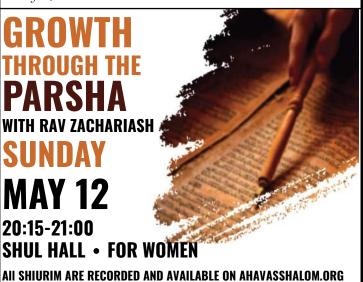
It was only the 7th day of Pesach but, with all the fun activities at the hotel, Yitzchak Tzvi already lost track of which day of the *omer* it was. At the end of *shemoneh esrei*, before everyone counted the *omer*, he turned to his cousin Pinny and



asked what night it was. May Pinny respond "Tonight is the 6th day of the *omer*" if he has specific intention not to fulfill his obligation to count the *omer* with this answer?

Yes. If Pinny has this positive intention not to fulfill his obligation to count the *omer*, then he will not fulfill his obligation with his response to his cousin, and may count with a *brocho* when the rest of the congregation counts. Note that the S.A. suggests that one should say yesterday's count, to avoid the issue, in case a person forgot to make this positive intention not to be "yotzeh."

משולחנו של הרב אברהם ברוך זכריש

עבודה קדושה עם חיוך

״דַבֵּר אֵל־כָּל־עַדַת בְּנִי־יִשִּׂרָאֵל וְאָמַרָתָּ אָלֵהֵם קִדשִׁים תִּהִיוּ כִּי קַדוֹשׁ אֲנִי..." (ויקרא יט:ב)

המשמעות המקובלת של להיות "קדוש" היא להפריד את עצמנו, כפי שנראה מהרמב"ן במבט ראשון. נשאלת השאלה, "אם קדושה פירושה הפרדה, מה המשמעות של סוף הפסוק "...כי קדוש אני"! האם לה' יש בעיות או מאבק שהוא צריך להיפרד מדברים אחרים!" אני חושב שזה ברור שבניגוד לאנשים, מטבע הדברים ה' הוא קדוש ומופרד. אז מה המשמעות של ציווי ה' שנפריד את עצמנו כמו שהוא מופרד?

אני רוצה להסביר על סמך משהו שראיתי מהרב ברוך מרדכי אזרחי. יש ביטוי באנגלית "פעם אלכוהוליסט, תמיד אלכוהוליסט." זה אומר שגם מי שיעבור תוכנית של 12 שלבים כדי להגמל מהאלכוהוליזם שלו, הנטייה הטבעית שלו לחפש אלכוהול תמיד תהיה שם. ההבדל היחיד הוא שהוא יוכל לשלוט בעצמו סביב אלכוהול. תוכנית 12 הצעדים לא ממש "ריפאה" את מחלת האלכוהוליזם שלו, אלא נתנה לו כלים כדי להתמודד איתה ולהתגבר על הדחף, מה שמקל עליו את הלחץ.

מצוטט מהרב ישראל סלנטר, "קל יותר ללמוד את כל הש"ס מאשר לשנות מידה אחת". לדעתי הוא אומר לנו שבעולם התורה, הצלחה אין פירושה להרחיק את התשוקה, אלא לבער אותה, ליצור מציאות שבה אין לנו חשק לאותה תחושה או התנהגות אסורה. זה נעשה באמצעות לימוד מוסר, כדי להפנים הערכה של מה הטוב, עד שאנו מבינים, ונדחים ממה שאינו טוב. על ידי עבודה על המידות שלנו, אנו יכולים ליצור יחס שונה לעולם.

יש דרך אחרת להשיג זאת, בעצם על ידי הימנעות מדברים מסוימים. הרב אזרחי מסביר שהרעיון שהרמב"ן מלמד אותנו, להפריד את עצמנו, אינו מתייחס רק להיפרד מהפעולות הלא נכונות, אלא זהו שלב של הפרדה מהתאווה עצמה.

פעם הייתה לי חוויה שממחישה את הרעיון הזה. צפיתי בילד אוכל גביע גלידה והופנטתי מהשמחה שלו, שקוע לגמרי בהנאה הזו. התגובה הראשונית שלי הייתה, " הלוואי ויכולתי ליהנות מגלידה כמוהו!" אבל אחרי המחשבה הזו, הייתה לי תחושת סלידה, ואמרתי לעצמי, "אני מקווה שלעולם לא אהנה מגלידה כזו!" למרות שזה עשוי להיות בסדר
