"and he shall have it, and his seed after him, the covenant of an everlasting priesthood; because he was zealous for his God, and made atonement for the children of Yisra'el." (Bamidbar 25:13)

The Torah tells us that Pinchas was given the kahuna as a reward for killing Kozbi. The Gemora in Zevachim (101b) tells us not only did he become a Kohen, but also those



who would be anointed as Kohanim Gedolim were descendants of Pinchas. Was that by chance, or was that also part of his reward?

The idea that the actions of a parent can affect future generations is probably most well-known through the story of the family of Eli Hakohen. Eli was cursed that all his descendants would die early - as early as age 18. While Abaye and Rava descended from Eli HaKohen, they each had a different merit which enabled them to live to the ages of 40 and 60, respectively. It is easy to understand that sometimes the sin of a parent has to be rectified through the punishment of the children. Based on this, it must be that Pinchas did something through which he and all his future descendants (See Yerushalmi Yuma 5a) merited to becoming Kohanim and even Kohanim Gedolim.

I would like to suggest that just as we know that the children of Avraham inherited certain qualities from him (e.g. chesed), so too a great act of any parent can embed greatness in his children's genes. This is why the children of Pinchas were befitting to become kohanim gedolim.

Nowadays, when people are faced with challenges, they often just give in to the situation, rather than persevering and doing the "right thing". Often, this is because they don't want to leave their comfort zone. Perhaps it is exactly in difficult circumstances such as these that if this person still rises to the occasion, he can modify his own genetic code, enabling him to bequeath this greatness to his offspring.

I would like to reiterate what the Chofetz Chaim (1838-1933) once told Rabbi Schwab (1908-1995), "The reason that I am a kohen and you are not is because when Moshe asked, 'Whoever is for G-d, gather around me' (Shemos 32:26) my ancestors came forward and yours did not."

The Chofetz Chaim then looked at Rav Schwab and said to him, "What do you think? I'm trying to make you feel bad?

Chas V'Sholom! But I want to teach you a lesson. Many times in life you will hear a little voice in your head saying, 'Whoever is for G-d, gather around me.' There will be circumstances, where you will have to decide in whose camp are you? I want you to know that questions and challenges like that have implications not only for you but for generations and generations after you. Because your grandfather did not answer in the affirmative to 'Who is for G-d, gather to me', you are excluded from the Temple Service, even thousands of years later. Because my grandfather said yes, I am a Kohen now and I am going to do the Temple Service."

I believe that Rabbi Schwab, who repeated this story on many occasions, felt empowered because of this message. This message, which Rav Schwab absorbed, actually made him into one of those great figures who go down in our history. Many of his children, grandchildren and greatgrandchildren feel the obligation to make a difference in society, as well.

The Three Weeks are upon us, and we have all kinds of laws and restrictions. There are many people who may be thinking to themselves, "Does what I do really make a difference"? The answer is, "Yes, you are making a difference!" Let us all merit, not only to believe in Hashem, but to believe that we have the ability to make a difference – not only in our own lives, but to our future generations as well.

Q&A: Shivering during the Shiva

Moshe Rosenberg was sitting Shiva for ►his son Tyler, but there weren't enough Jews in Damascus, PA, to form a minyon in his home. So he got in his pickup truck and drove to Anshei Emes in Honesdale. But on the second day of shiva it was too cold to go outside without a coat, so he put on a heavy coat over his ripped overalls. Is Moshe required to rip this overcoat, since it is now his "outer garment"?



No. The custom is to not rip an overcoat since it is considered a temporary garment, normally worn outside for the cold and rain. This is true even if it is so cold inside the house that Moshe needed to wear a heavy coat inside. However, sweaters and short jackets which are normally worn inside the home, would have to be ripped.

Q&A: Saving a Patient—and a Uniform

Just after midnight, Mel Hoffman's mother went

into cardiac arrest. The nurse on duty at the Sinai Nursing Home quickly called an ambulance, and Eli the



EMT rushed Mrs. Hoffman to the Boca Health Care Center. But during the ride, Mrs. Hoffman flat-lined, and even though Eli tried valiantly to bring her back, he was unable to do so, and she was declared dead upon arrival. Since Eli was present at the time of death, is he obligated to rip his clothing?

No. While the rule is that anyone present at the exact moment of death is obligated to rip his clothing, the custom developed to exempt doctors and medical staff. This was due to the fear that if these professionals had to rip their clothing each and every time a patient died, they might opt to stay away from a patient at these critical moments before death rather than be with the patient and potentially lose another outfit. There are those who even extend this leniency to non-medical staff so that no one will leave the dying patient alone due to financial concerns.

משולחנו של הרב אברהם ברוך זכריש

השפעות ארוכות טווח

וְהָיְתָה לוֹ וּלְזַרְעוֹ אַחֲרִיו בְּרִית כְּהַנַּת עוֹלָם תַּחַת אֲשֶׁר קְנֵּא לֵאלֹקִיו וַיְכַפֶּר עַלֹ־בָּנִי יִשְׂרָאָלֹ: (במדבר כה:יג)

התורה אומרת שפנחס קיבל כהונה כשכר על הריגת כזבי. ולא רק זה, אלא גם "שלא היו כהנים גדולים אלא מפנחס" (זבחים קא:ב רש"י ד"ה לייחס זרעו אחריו). האם זה גם היה חלק מהשכר שלו!

הרעיון שמעשי האבות יכולים להשפיע על הדורות הבאים מוכר היטב מהסיפור על משפחתו של עלי הכהן. עלי קבל קללה שכל צאצאיו ימותו מוקדם – אפילו מגיל 18 אביי ורבא היו צאצאי עלי הכהן, לרבא היתה זכות לימוד התורה והוא חי עד גיל 40, ולאביי היתה זכות תורה וגמילות חסדים וחי עד לגיל 60, קל להבין שלפעמים יש לתקן את חטאם של האבות באמצעות עונשם של הבנים. לכן צריך להיות שפנחס עשה משהו שבאמצעותו הוא (ראה ירושלמי יומא ה א) וכל צאצאיו העתידיים זכו להיות כהנים ואפילו כהנים גדולים.

אני רוצה להציע שכפי שאנו יודעים שילדיו של אברהם ירשו ממנו תכונות מסוימות (כגון מדת החסד), כך מעשים גדולים של כל הורה יכולים להטמיע גדולה בגנים של ילדיו. זו הסיבה שבני פנחס היו ראויים להיות כהנים גדולים.

כיום, כאשר אנשים מתמודדים עם אתגרים, הם לרוב פשוט נכנעים למצב, במקום להתמיד ולעשות את "הדבר הנכון". בדרך כלל זה בגלל שהם לא רוצים לעזוב את אזור הנוחות שלהם. אולי דווקא במצבים קשים כמו אלה, אם האדם הזה בכל זאת יתעלה, הוא יכול לשנות את הקוד הגנטי שלו, שיאפשר לו להוריש את הגדולה הזו לצאצאיו.

אני רוצה לחזור על מה שאמר פעם החפץ חיים לרבי שוואב, "הסיבה שאני כהן ואתה לא היא כי כשמשה שאל, 'מי לה' אלי' (שמות לב:כו) אבותי נאספו אליו ושלד לא."

הסתכל החפץ חיים על הרב שוואב ואמר לו: "אתה חושב שאני מנסה לגרום לך להרגיש רע? חס וחלילה! אני רק רוצה ללמד אותך לקח. הרבה פעמים בחיים תשמע בראשך קול קטן שאומר, 'מי לה' אלי'. יהיו מצבים שתצטרך להחליט במחנה של מי אתה? אני רוצה שתדע שלשאלות ואתגרים כאלה יש השלכות לא רק עליך אלא על דורי דורות אחריך. מכיוון שסבא שלך לא ענה בחיוב על 'מי לה' אלי', אתה נמנע מעבודת המקדש, גם אלפי שנים לאחר מכן. ובגלל שסבא שלי אמר כן, אני כהן ואני ראוי לעשות עבודה בבית המקדש".
