Resolve or Dissolve

"...but as for the tree of knowledge of good and bad, you must not eat of it; for as soon as you eat of it, you shall surely die." (Bereishis 2:17)

The source verse above was said by Hashem to Adam Harishon. To me, this seems to indicate that the punishment would be immediate if Adam would take a bite he would drop dead right then and there.



The question is obvious: While HaKadosh Baruch Hu gave Adam Harishon a list of curses on that day, he lived for nearly a thousand years after this incident!

The Vilna Gaon answers this question by explaining that there are two kinds of punishments. There are punishments which are consequences of the act itself, and punishments unrelated to the action that was perpetrated, but are for disobeying.

Examples of punishments which are consequences are: If a mother tells her child "Avramele, don't stick your finger in the electrical socket, because you will get a severe shock!" If Avramele doesn't listen, the "punishment" of being shocked is a direct and immediate outcome of his action. Or, if a mother tells her child, "Avramele, put on your coat before you go outside, otherwise you'll catch a cold!" While not as direct, if Avramele doesn't listen and catches a cold shortly thereafter, it is also a direct result of his action.

An example of punishment which is not a direct consequence, would be: If a mother tells her child "Avramale, if you listen to Mummy and clean your room like the good little boy that you are, then I will allow you to go on your class trip tomorrow. However, if you ignore your Mummy and leave your room a mess, I will not permit you to go." This punishment, though inspired by the failure to clean his room, is a *result* of not following the mother's instructions.

When Adam Harishon ate from the etz hadas, he disobeyed a commandment from Hashem, and he also caused his body to have to die. The pasuk saying "mos yamus," does not necessarily mean "You will die as a punishment." Rather, it means that you have introduced "death" to your body, and your body will eventually die because of your action.

Many of us have made certain resolutions to travel on a particular path during the year 5785. It is now, at the beginning of our journey, that we need to be most vigilant

Q&A: The First Aliyah

The winner of the 30th annual auction for the first aliyah of the year at The Boca Shul was Solly Wertheimer, who won with an astronomical (for Boca) bid of \$50,000! On Parshas Bereishis, may Solly be called up for the first aliyah, even though he is a Yisrael, or must he give it to a Kohen, since the first aliyah is always meant for a Kohen?

Solly is permitted to be called up for this aliyah even though he is a Yisrael. This is because when the shul's minhag of auctioning off this aliyah was established 30 years ago, the Kohanim were mochel their kavod and permitted anyone — including a Yisrael — to get this coveted first aliyah of parshas Bereishis. It is preferred that the Kohanim leave the shul when the brocho is made, but even if the Kohanim do not leave, Solly may still take the aliyah and make the brocho.

נחישות או התלבטות

וּמֵעץ הַדַּעַת טוֹב וָרָע לֹא תֹאכַל מִמֵּנוּ כִּי בִּיוֹם אַכָלְדְּ מִמֵּנוּ מוֹת הַמוּת: (בראשית ב:יז)

את הפסוק הנ"ל אמר ה' לאדם הראשון. לדעתי זה מעיד שהעונש יהיה מיידי - אם אדם יאכל אותו הוא ימות מיד.

אך במקום זאת, אנו מוצאים שהקב"ה קילל את אדם הראשון באותו יום, אך הוא חי קרוב לאלף שנים!

הגאון מוילנא מסביר שיש שני סוגי עונשים. יש עונשים שהם תוצאות של המעשים עצמם, ועונשים שאינם קשורים למעשים שנעשו, אלא הם על אי ציות.

דוגמאות לעונשים שהם השלכות, אם אמא אומרת לבנה, "אברמלה, אל תכניס את האצבע לשקע החשמל, כי אתה תקבל מכת חשמל קשה!" אם אברמלה לא מקשיב, "העונש" של התחשמלות הוא תוצאה ישירה ומיידית של פעולתו. או, אם אמא אומרת לבנה, "אברמלה, תלבש את המעיל שלך לפני שאתה יוצא החוצה, אחרת אתה תצטנן!" התוצאה אמנם לא ישירה, אבל אם אברמל לא מקשיב ומצטנן זמן קצר לאחר מכן, זו גם תוצאה ישירה של הפעולה שלו.

דוגמה לענישה שאינה תוצאה ישירה, היא אמא שאומרת לבנה, "אברמאלה, אם תנקה את החדר שלך כמו הילד הטוב שאתה, אז אני ארשה לך לצאת לטיול הכיתתי שלך מַחַר. אבל אם תתעלם מאמא ותשאיר את החדר שלך מבולגן, אני לא ארשה לך ללכת." עונש זה, על אף שנגרם מאי ניקוי חדרו, הוא כתוצאה מאי ציות להוראות

כשאדם הראשון אכל מהעץ הדעת, הוא לא ציית למצוות ה', וגם גרם לגופו הכרח למות. הפסוק "מות תמות", לא אומרת "אתה תמות כעונש", אלא זה אומר שהכנסת "מוות" לגוף שלך, וגופך ימות בסופו של דבר בגלל המעשה שלך.

רבים מאיתנו קיבלנו החלטות מסוימות לנסוע בנתיב מסוים במהלך שנת 5785. כעת, בתחילת דרכנו, עלינו להיות ערניים ביותר במניעת ולו הפרה קטנה אחת, שכן זה יכול לסלול את הדרך עבור כל הנחישות שלנו להתמוטט, מה שתחייב אותנו למצוא דרך חדשה לתשובה - אם לא מיד, אז בוודאי עד סוף השנה.
