You Are What You Eat

And every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth shall be held abominable; it shall not be eaten. (Vayikra 11:41)

At the end of the *Parsha*, the Torah speaks about us not eating insects, cockroaches, creepy-crawling creatures. Rashi quotes the *Tana Divei Rebbe Yishmael*, who says that if it wouldn't be for anything else, just that the *Bnei Yisrael* would not eat



these insects, that would have been enough of a reason to take them out of Egypt. Rav Moshe Feinstein (1895 –1986) asks on this statement of *Chazal*: Most people in the Western World already feel so repulsed by these types of insects that they would not eat them even without a commandment. Insects are disgusting to most people, unlike ham and other non-kosher foods. So, what is so special about the Jew not eating these bugs?

He answers based on our practical application of this Mitzvah. Most people would generally prefer not to eat bugs, but if a bug happened to be in their lettuce, it wouldn't bother them that much. However, it would bother Jews, who do not eat bugs because it is a commandment of Hashem. This is demonstrated by our being extra careful to continuously check to ensure that our foods are clean from bugs so that we don't consume bugs even in very small amounts or even accidentally.

He explains this with the following idea: Even though we are naturally repulsed by these bugs, being that the Torah commanded us not to eat them, the commandment gives it religious significance, and we are by far more careful than a gentile would be. He calls not eating the bugs because they are repulsive a "shelo lishma" way of doing a mitzvah. We don't eat bugs because we understand it is repulsive, but we also understand that it is a commandment from Hashem, and we get credit for relating to it as a mitzvah. This turns it into a Mitzvah Lishma.

Rav Shimshon Rafael Hirsch (1808 – 1888) takes this to another level. He tells us that the word "sheketz" means something which is diametrically opposed to our being. We are a holy people, and these creepy, crawly things are the opposite of who we are. Therefore, most of the things which we are not allowed to eat, we are not even allowed to possess or do business with them because they are a contradiction to our definition of being a Jew (albeit with a few exceptions, such as dealing with the forbidden fat (Continued on page 2)

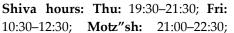

(chelev), or owning non-kosher animals which are used for working purposes).

In English there is an expression "You are what you eat." It seems that this idea has roots in *Chazal*, and we should not eat the things which are a contrast to what and who we are. I believe this is the basic understanding of a *Chasidic* statement, that a person who is careful regarding what he eats becomes a holier Jew.

Someone once came to Rav Shlomo Zalman Auerbach (1910-1995) and asked him: I know someone who wants to start becoming religious. He is willing to start with either *Shemiras Shabbos* or keeping kosher, what should I tell him? Rav S.Z. said *kashrus*. The person asked, "But a person who violates Shabbos is punished with death by *skila*, whereas violating *kashrus* is only a negative commandment?!" Rav S. Z. answered that since the food one eats affects one spiritually, the quicker the person stops eating *treif*, the quicker he will be ready to become fully religious.

May we merit to eat only those things which are not only good for us physically but are good for our souls as well.

Q&A: Counting Kitty

"Daddy, Hello Kitty and I want to count the *omer* together this year," announced 12-year-old Rivky, "and both of us want to say the *brocho* every night because it is such an important mitzvah." Should Reuven advise his daughter to say a *brocho* every night of the *omer* according to the M.B. and the A.H.?

M.B.: No. While a woman is permitted to count the *omer* every night, she should not count with a *brocho* because, as she does not go to synagogue every night, it is very likely that she will either miss a night or make some type of mistake during the 49 days of counting.

A.H.: Yes. This is no different than any other mitzvah in which a woman is not obligated: She may do the mitzvah with a *brocho* if desired. However, she must try her best to count all 49 days without missing one.

Q&A: A Sefira Wedding?

Unfortunately, Levy divorced his wife Yocheved in the summer, but they both met each other at a singles retreat during Pesach and decided to remarry right away. However, Levy has the custom to keep the "omer" mourning period from Pesach to Lag B'Omer. When is the earliest that Levy and Yocheved may get married?

1)They must wait until Lag B'Omer.

2)They may marry immediately after Pesach.

2. Levy would be permitted to marry his ex-wife immediately after Pesach. While marriages are normally prohibited during this time period, one is permitted to remarry his ex-wife. However, it should be noted, that a man may only remarry his ex-wife if she is still permitted to him: If the ex-wife married another man after her divorce, she would be forbidden to return to her original husband.

משולחנו של הרב אברהם ברוך זכריש

אתה מה שאתה אוכל

וְכלֹ־הַשֶּׁרֶץ הַשֹּׁרֵץ עֵּל־הָאָרֶץ שֶׁקֶץ הוּא לֹא יֵאָכֵל (ויקרא יא:מא) בסוף הפרשה, התורה מדברת על כך שאסור לנו לאכול שרצים. רש"י כותב "תְּנָא דְּבֵי רַבִּי יִשְׁמְעֵאל: אִלְמְלֵי לֹא הַעֲלֵיתִי אֶת יִשְׂרָאֵל מִמְּצְרִיִם אֶלְּא בְּשְׁבִיל שָׁאֵין מִשַּמְאִין הָשֶּלִיתִי אֶת יִשְׂרָאֵל מִמְצְרִיִם אֶלְּא בְּשְׁבִיל שָׁאֵין מִשַּמְאִין בּשְׁרָצִים בְּשְׁרָצִים בְּשְׁרָאִים המערבי כבר נגעלים אפילו שואל ,"רוב האנשים בעולם המערבי כבר נגעלים אפילו מהמחשבה לאכול שרצים, עד כדי כך שלא יאכלו אותם אפילו בלי צווי, בניגוד לחזיר ולמאכלים לא כשרים אחרים. אז מה כל כך מיוחד בכך שבני ישראל לא יאכלו שרצים?"

הוא עונה על סמך איך שמקיימים מצווה זו באופן מעשי. רוב האנשים בעולם המערבי מעדיפים בדרך כלל לא לאכול שרצים, אך אם במקרה נמצא חרק בחסה שלהם, זה לא היה מפריע להם כל כך. עם זאת, יהודים לא אוכלים שרצים משום שזו מצוות ה', דבר המתבטא בכך שאנו מקפידים לבדוק באופן מתמיד שהאוכל שלנו נקי מחרקים, כך שלא נאכל חרקים אפילו בכמויות קטנות מאוד או אפילו בטעות.

הוא ממשיך להסביר שכאשר לא אוכלים את החרקים רק בגלל שהם מגעילים, אכן מקיימים את המצווה, אבל זה ברמת "שלא לשמה". אבל כאשר מתייחסים אליה גם כאל מצוות ה', זה מעלה אותה ל"מצווה לשמה".

הרב שמשון רפאל הירש מעלה את זה לעוד רמה. הוא אומר שהמילה "שקץ" פירושה משהו שהוא מנוגד לחלוטין להווייתנו. אנחנו עם קדוש והדברים הזוחלים והשורצים האלה הם ההפך הגמור ממי שאנחנו. לכן, את רוב הדברים שאסור לנו לאכול, אפילו אסור לנו להחזיק או לעשות איתם עסקים משום שהם סותרים את הגדרתנו כיהודים (אם כי למעט כמה יוצאים מן הכלל, כמו שימוש בחלב אסור, או החזקת בעלי חיים לא כשרים למטרות ערודה)

יש פתגם, "אתה מה שאתה אוכל", שנראה לי שזה מבוסס על חז"ל, שאסור לנו לאכול את הדברים שהם בניגוד למה המשך בעמד 3
