#### Response-able

"But they answered, "Should our sister be treated like a harlot?" (Bereishis 34:31)

Hishtadlus is one of the most important things in all the activities that Jews do, whether it is getting a good chavrusa, finding a wife, or getting a job. We have an obligation to make the best effort we can. However, it is unclear hishtadlus is appropriate and even when it is, what is the correct amount?



For example, if Reuven needs a job, and he can make the manager of a company feel uncomfortable with Shimon, causing the manager to fire Shimon, which would allow Reuven to take over Shimon's job - that kind of effort is forbidden. Or, if Reuven wants to grow in learning, and he therefore decides to go to a class which is far above his level, his efforts will not succeed. Our job is, in all areas, to find the proper balance as to how much effort one needs to

In some situations, it seems that making any effort will be unproductive. Yet we feel that we not only need to do something, but we have to do something that is very drastic in order to have a chance at producing results. The Chazon Ish says that in those situations, we probably have no obligation of hishtadlus. His proof of this is from next week's parsha when Yosef asked the chief bartender to "put in a good word for him." Yosef knew full well that this Egyptian was an anti-Semite and would not willingly help him, and therefore this request was not hishtadlus, but an act of desperation which should not have been done at all. We therefore must know when we are going beyond our range of normal for who we are and what our situation is.

In this week's parsha, Shimon and Levi take action against the citizens of Shechem because of what Shechem did to their sister Dina. Yaakov tells his sons that this was improper behavior, which could only bring about negative results. The sons responded that they could not let such a thing happen to their sister with no consequences. The Meforshim comment that the son's response doesn't really address Yaakov's concerns.

It seems to me that the explanation is that sometimes one must respond to an issue even if it is not the proper hishtadlus, as there needs to be some response to show that



we cannot allow this issue to continue to exist. The brothers' answer was not an explanation of how what they did will rectify the situation. Rather, it was a response of pain and a supplication to Hashem, showing that the issue had to be taken care of. They were really saying, "We cannot allow this issue to go unanswered."

So too us, in our lives, we often find ourselves in a predicament to which we must respond. Yet, we just do not seem to have the right response. At that time, whether one is conducting himself according to the Chazon Ish who says that we have no obligation for hishtadlus, or whether one is reacting according to this other explanation (that some situations warrant a reaction), we need to just throw up our hands to Hashem and say, "Help!"



But doing a feeble *hishtadlus* will only bring us to a similar situation to that which Yosef found himself in, where his efforts were detrimental to him and not a merit. Feeling helpless should instead spur us on to connect with Hashem in a greater way.






#### **O&A:** Chanukah Weekend at Bernie's

"My mansion in the Hamptons is empty this weekend. Why don't you use it?" offered Bernie Lowenstein to Levy and Yocheved on Shabbos Chanukah, and the two took him up on the offer. They brought all their food and Levy brought three large candles to light for the second night of Chanukah. However, just moments before they lit, Yocheved realized that she forgot to bring her own Shabbos candles. What is the preferred way that they divide these three candles amongst themselves?

1)Levy should light two candles for his menorah and one for his *shamash*, and Yocheved should not light at all.

2)Levy should light two candles for his menorah and Yocheved should light one candle for Shabbos.

3)Levy should light one candle for his menorah and Yocheved should light two candles for Shabbos (as she always does).

2. Levy should light 2 candles for Chanukah and Yocheved should light 1 for Shabbos. Even though it is proper for Yocheved to light 2 candles as she normally does, in this case, it is better to light 2 candles for Chanukah and fulfill the obligation of "mehadrin." One candle for Shabbos will suffice in this second-best situation by providing sufficient light where the couple will eat.

#### **Q&A:** Reduce, Reuse, Relight

Shlomo Kagan lit his Chanukah menorah in a glass box on the 2nd night outside his home and, after davening *maariv*, returned home and eventually went to sleep. In the morning, as he went to *shacharis*, he noticed that the two glass cups in his menorah were still full — indicating that the flames must have been blown out by the wind sometime soon after *maariv*. On the third night, what must he do?

1)Shlomo must pour **new** oil into all three cups, as the oil currently in the first two cups was designated for the second night.

2)Shlomo may simply fill up the third cup with oil only, as he is permitted to reuse the oil in the first two cups.

2. It is permitted to re-use the oil on subsequent days. OC 677 M.B. 17

# משולחנו של הרב אברהם ברוך זכריש

#### להגיב או לא

וַיֹּאמָרוּ הַכָּזוֹנָה יַעֲשֶׁה אֱת־אֱחוֹתֵנוּ (בראשית לד:לא)

השתדלות היא אחד הדברים החשובים ביותר בכל הפעילויות שיהודים עושים, בין אם זה לקבל חברותא טובה, למצוא בן או בת זוג, או לקבל עבודה. אנחנו צריכים לעשות את המאמץ הכי טוב שאנחנו יכולים. עם זאת, ייתכן שלא ברור מתי השתדלות מתאימה וגם אם כן, מהי הרמה הנכונה?

למשל, אם ראובן צריך עבודה, והוא יכול לגרום למנהל להרגיש לא בנוח עם שמעון, שזה יגרום למנהל לפטר את שמעון, מה שיאפשר לראובן להשתלט על תפקידו של שמעון - מאמץ כזה אסור. או אם ראובן רוצה לצמוח בלימוד התורה, ולכן הוא מחליט ללכת לשיעור שהוא הרבה מעל רמתו, מאמץ כזה לא יצליח. התפקיד שלנו הוא, בכל התחומים, למצוא את האיזון המתאים לכמה מאמץ אנחנו צריכים להשקיע.

במצבים מסוימים נראה שכל מאמץ לא יועיל. אבל אנחנו מרגישים לא רק שצריכים לעשות משהו, אלא שצריכים אפילו לעשות משהו מאוד קיצוני כדי שיהיה לנו סיכוי להפיק תוצאות. החזון איש אומר שבאותם מצבים כנראה אין לנו חובת השתדלות. הוא מוכיח זאת מפרשת השבוע הבא, כאשר יוסף ביקש משר המשקים להכניס לו מילה טובה עם פרעה. יוסף ידע היטב שהמצרי הזה הוא אנטישמי ולא יעזור לו ברצון, ולכן בקשה זו לא הייתה השתדלות, אלא מעשה נואש שהיה עדיף לא להיעשות כלל. לכן עלינו לדעת מתי אנחנו חורגים ממה שמתאים למי שאנחנו ולמצבנו.

בפרשת השבוע, שמעון ולוי פועלים נגד אזרחי שכם בגלל מה ששכם עשה לאחותם דינה. יעקב אומר לבניו שזו הייתה התנהגות לא נכונה, שעלולה להביא רק לתוצאות שליליות. הבנים השיבו שהם לא יכולים לתת לדבר כזה לקרות לאחותם ללא השלכות. המפרשים מעירים כי תגובתם לא ממש מתייחסת לחששותיו של יעקב.

נראה לי שההסבר הוא שלפעמים צריך להגיב לבעיה גם אם זו לא ההשתדלות הראויה, שכן צריך תגובה כלשהי כדי להראות שאנחנו לא יכולים לתת למצב הזה להמשיך להתקיים. תשובת האחים לא הייתה הסבר כיצד מה שהם עשו יתקן את המצב. אלא זו הייתה תגובה של כאב ותחינה לה', להראות שיש לטפל בנושא. הם באמת אמרו, "אנחנו לא יכולים לתת לנושא הזה להישאר ללא מענה."

כך גם בחיינו, לעתים קרובות אנו מוצאים את עצמנו במצוקה שעלינו להגיב אליה. עם זאת, לא נראה לנו שיש תגובה נכונה. במקרה כזה, בין אם מתנהגים לפי החזון איש שאומר שאין לנו שום חיוב בהשתדלות, ובין אם מגיבים לפי ההסבר השני (שיש מצבים שמחייבים תגובה), צריכים פשוט להרים ידיים לה' ולצעוק "הצילו!" לעשות איזו השתדלות חלשה רק תביא אותנו למצב דומה לזה שיוסף נקלע אליו, שבו מאמציו הזיקו לו במקום לעזור. תחושת חוסר אונים צריכה במקום זאת לעודד אותנו להתחבר עם ה' בצורה טובה יותר.
