Leveling Up

'Moshe went out to meet his father-inlaw; he bowed and kissed him and he asked him how he was doing..." (Shemos 18:7)

The above verse doesn't specify whether it was Moshe who bowed to and kissed Yisro, or Yisro who bowed to and kissed Moshe. The midrash proves that Moshe was the one who bowed down because Moshe is



referred to as 'Ish ("Viha'ish Moshe Anav Miode" Bamidbar 12:3) and here the word Ish is used as well, therefore it must be that Moshe bowed and kissed Yisro. But what is the meaning of this bowing and kissing? Moshe was a greater person than Yisro, so why was Moshe bowing down to someone of a lesser stature than himself?

The Shem Mishmuel (Shmuel Bornsztain 1855-1926) explains that the reason that Yisro came was to learn from Moshe Rabbeinu and absorb some of his kedusha. The problem was that Moshe Rabbeinu was on such a high level that it was not possible for Yisro to connect to him. Moshe bowed to lower himself to Yisro's level so that Yisro could then connect to him. Moshe's kissed Yisro to enable their souls to connect so that Yisro could learn from Moshe. This endeavor succeeded and Yisro was able to learn from Moshe.

Chazal tell us that there are many situations where one must lower himself in order to grow. For example, the gemora (Bava Metzi'a 59a) states, "...people say, 'If your wife is short, bend down and hear her whisper!" The commentators explain this to mean that sometimes a man must digress from his high levels of spirituality so that his wife will be able to connect to him, and then together they can create the proper home for their children. These minor steps down are a step forward in the growth of their home and/or marriage.

In our own personal journey, we may be in Shul and find ourselves sitting next to someone who is doing something that is getting on our nerves (such as tapping the table or rocking his chair). It may even get to the point that we want to yell at the person, "Find another seat!". Another possibility is that one considers himself a "baal madrega" and says to himself "Maybe I should find another seat!". I would like to suggest that we can learn something from everyone in our community. Perhaps we just have to be white-knuckled and bear it, so that we will glean positivity (Continued on page 2)

As we stand in the parsha of "k'ish echad bilev echad", it is important for us to try to find something positive to learn from all of those that Hashem put around us. This is true even if we think that those people are not on "our level".



Q&A: Preparing for Day 2 on Day I

The luncheon on the first day of Shavuos lasted until the late afternoon. Before bentching, everyone cleared off the table and stacked all the dishes in the sink. Mr. Goldberg's son-in-law led the bentching and the men then went to

Kehillas Shaarei Shamavim for mincha, which would then be followed by *maariv* for the second day of Shavuos. May Mrs. Goldberg and her daughter use this "quiet time" to clean the dishes in the sink, so that she will have clean dishes for dinner on the second day of Shavuos?



No. This would be considered preparing on the first day of Yom Tov for the second day of Yom Tov, which is prohibited. However, there are various leniencies regarding washing dishes so, if Mrs. Goldberg was washing the dishes so that she could better enjoy the first day of Yom Tov, she might be permitted to do so. OC 503 M.B. 1

Q&A:A Raw Deal

Harry Brochstein left to go to mincha at The Boca Shul about 45 minutes before sunset on the first day of Sukkos, which would be followed by *maariv* on the second day of Sukkos. Mrs. Brochstein said goodbye, then went to check on the food for the second-day dinner in the refrigerator, as she expected a full sukkah/dining room for dinner. When Juanita opened the pot containing the roast, Mrs. Brochstein heard her yell, "Ay Carumba!" as they both realized that they had forgotten to cook it! Mrs. Brochstein calculated that if she put the roast on right now it would be ready when the guests returned in about two hours. Is she permitted to put it into the oven now?

No. Cooking food so close to the end of the first day of Yom Tov would unquestionably be considered preparing for the second day of Yom Tov, and it is prohibited to prepare on the first day of Yom Tov for the second. However, if Mrs. Brochstein ignored this prohibition and cooked the roast, she would be permitted to serve and eat it. If she had realized her error earlier in the day (when there would have been sufficient time to both cook and eat the roast), then it would have been permitted to cook the roast, as it would appear as if she was cooking food for the first day of Sukkos.

וַיֵּצֵא מֹשֶׁה לִקְרָאת חֹתְנוֹ, וַיִּשְׁתַּחוּ וַיִּשַּׁקְ–לוֹ, וַיִּשְׁאֲלוּ אִישׁ–לְרֵעֵהוּ, לְשָׁלוֹם (שמות יח:ז)

הפסוק אינו מציין אם זה היה משה שהשתחווה ונישק את שהשתחווה ונישק את יתרו, או יתרו שהשתחווה ונישק את משה. המדרש מביא הוכחה שמשה הוא זה שהשתחוה, מהפסוק "והאיש משה ענו מאד" (במדבר יב:ג) שבו מכונה משה 'איש' וכאן משתמשים גם במילה איש, אם כן, וודאי היה זה משה שהשתחווה ונישק את יתרו. אבל מה המשמעות של ההשתחוות והנשיקה הזו! בנוסף, משה היה אדם גדול יותר מיתרו, אז למה משה השתחווה לאדם פחות ממנו!

ה'שם משמואל' מסביר שהסיבה שיתרו בא הייתה ללמוד ממשה רבנו ולספוג חלק מהקדושה שלו. הבעיה הייתה שמשה רבנו היה ברמה כל כך גבוהה עד שאי אפשר היה ליתרו להתחבר אליו. משה השתחווה על מנת להוריד את עצמו לרמה של יתרו כדי שיתרו יוכל להתחבר אליו. משה נישק את יתרו כדי לאפשר לנפשם להתחבר כדי שיתרו יוכל ללמוד ממשה. מאמץ זה הצליח ויתרו אכן הצליח ללמוד ממשה.

חז"ל אומרים לנו שיש מצבים שבהם צריכים להוריד את עצמנו כדי לצמוח. למשל, הגמרא אומרת "והא אמרי אינשי איתתך גוצא גחין ותלחוש לה" (אומרים 'אם אשתך נמוכה, התכופף ושמע אותה לוחשת"") (בבא מציעא נט:א) המפרשים מסבירים שלפעמים אדם צריך לחרוג מרמות הרוחניות הגבוהות שלו כדי להתחבר עם אשתו, ואז יחד יוכלו ליצור בית המתאים לגידול ילדיהם. הירידות הקטנות האלו מהוות צעד קדימה בצמיחת ביתם ו/או נישואיהם.

במסע האישי שלנו, אנו עשויים להיות בבית הכנסת יושבים ליד מישהו שבאמת מפריע לנו ולמשל הוא מקיש על השולחן או מנדנד בכיסאו). זה יכול אפילו להביא אותנו למצב שאנחנו רוצים לצרוח עליו, "עבור למקום אחר!", או אם אנחנו מחשיבים את עצמנו כ"בעלי מדרגה" עשויים לחשוב "אולי אני אעבור למקום אחר!". אני רוצה להציע שנוכל ללמוד מכל אחד ואחד בקהילה שלנו. אולי אנחנו פשוט צריכים לחרוק שיניים ולסבול, כדי להוציא
